Brief Description of the target groups	<p>The target group comes from representatives of three cities – Polish Nakło nad Notecią, Slovenian Naklo and Czech Náklo. These are residents of the above-mentioned partner cities, wanted to establish contacts with foreign partners, open to exchanging knowledge and views on functioning in the structures of the European Union. The project beneficiaries included adults, but the most prominent representation was made up of youth coming from all three locations mentioned.</p> <p>What is extremely important, the project participants come from different countries and cities. These cities (Polish Nakło nad Notecią, Slovenian Naklo and Czech Náklo) are of different sizes, but in none of the mentioned cases are they large urban agglomerations. We are talking about small towns, distant from large cities - where similar opportunities for meetings with peers are much more limited. By participating in the project, each participant was able to learn more about the fundamental values and functioning of the European Union and express their views by participating in discussions and debates. The implementation of this international mobility also gave the project participants and the local community the opportunity to strengthen cooperation at the cross-border level.</p> <p>Me, the Citizen of the European Union as the leading theme of the project also aimed to make citizens of the European Union aware of their rights, obligations and common values regarding the structure of the European Union. During the meeting, the participants exchanged their individual experiences and observations, and shared their knowledge about the functioning of democratic mechanisms in each countries.</p>

Agenda of the event	<p>26.05.2025 – Arrival Day: Welcome Meeting On May 26, 2025, project partners from Slovenia and Poland arrived in Litovel, Czech Republic. The Slovenian group was accommodated at www.mlynice.com, and the Polish group at www.relaxlitovel.cz. Check-in took place between 14:00 and 19:00. In the evening, all teams met for a welcome dinner at Restaurace Zálůžna, during which the hosts introduced the final agenda, practical arrangements, and expectations for the week. Number of participants: arrival and welcome meeting – not formally recorded.</p> <p>27.05.2025 – DAY 1: Workshop – 63 Participants (within 48 foreigners) The first day of mobility began at 9:30 a.m. with the Opening Ceremony at <i>Fara Náklo</i>. It was followed by a workshop titled "Global climate change and the EU. Local society preserves natural heritage" with 63 participants (confirmed by list of attendance). After lunch, participants joined an educational trip to Olomouc, where they took part in a field game identifying visible effects of climate change in the urban environment. The outdoor activity provided an engaging way to connect environmental theory with direct observation and teamwork. The day ended with a group evaluation and dinner at Restaurace Zálůžna.</p> <p>28.05.2025 – DAY 2: Open Space Event – 105 Participants At 9:00 a.m., the Open Space event began at <i>Sokolovna Náklo</i>, attended by 105 participants, including students from Palacký University and local residents. The session focused on climate change and its impact on small communities, with presentations by academic experts and open debate sessions. After lunch, participants went on an educational field trip to Jeskyně Javoříčko, where they learned about preserving Europe's natural heritage through workshops and guided tours. Dinner followed back in Litovel. After dinner leaders of the group had evaluation meeting.</p> <p>29.05.2025 – DAY 3: Cultural and Historical Event – 124 Participants At 10:00 a.m., a Cultural and Historical Event titled "20 Years in the EU" took place at <i>Sokolovna Náklo</i>. The event attracted 124 participants, including community members. It featured cultural performances, folk dances, and showcases from all three partner countries, celebrating EU membership and multicultural dialogue.</p>

	<p>In the afternoon, participants visited <i>Bazylika na Kopečku</i> in Olomouc, where they explored spiritual and cultural heritage. Dinner concluded the day.</p> <p>At the end of the Cultural and Historical Event, an evaluation meeting was conducted to gather feedback from participants, summarize key impressions, and reflect on the overall impact of the day's activities</p> <p>30.05.2025 – Final Conference.</p> <p>The final day of the mobility concluded with a Conference summarizing and disseminating the project held at <i>Fara Náklo</i>. The event was attended by 101 participants (with 42 foreigners), including foreign guests from Slovenia and Poland (confirmed by list of attendance). This one-day public event aimed to present the final results of the project and reflect on the activities carried out in each partner country. The conference was open to all residents, including those who had not previously taken part in the project's workshops, debates, or events. Each partner organization (Delta Partner, Gmina Nakło nad Notecią, Obec Náklo, Občina Naklo) gave a 10-minute summary speech outlining their involvement and key outcomes. Participants also presented their reflections under the theme "Me, the Citizen of the EU", using speeches, creative work, and group conclusions.</p> <p>The conference served as a dissemination platform to share the effects of the workshops, debates, cultural events, and educational activities with a wider audience. It provided space for discussion, reflection on the importance of European citizenship, and the need for continued dialogue on issues that impact all Europeans.</p> <p>The event also laid the groundwork for future cooperation and new initiatives, including the development of further project activities and a series of future cross-border debates. The meeting closed with a shared lunch and final goodbyes.</p>
